

Report of Swachh Bharat Activities

Sri Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya College of Education (Autonomous) conducted a Scout Camp from 16.04.2023 to 21.04.2023. Among these days we planned one Trekking cum Swachh Bharat Activity at Aranganathar Temple, Palamalai, Coimbatore on 19.04.2023. We obtained prior permission from both the Forest Office and Temple In-charge, who generously agreed to provide lunch for our group.

On 19th April 2023 morning 8:15 am, we started from the college using buses and bikes. We reached at Palamalai Hill approximately 9.15 am and parked vehicles before gathering together. In total 42 members (38) students, Sri. B. Sivakumaran, Scout Leader, Sri. R. Lakshmanan, Scout Master, Sri A, Bhaskaran, Scout Master and Dr. S. Sivasankar Camp Coordinator reached the Palamalai. Report of Guru Puja – Child Art Competitions (2023)

Sri Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya College of Education has organized Guru Puja Child Art Competitions for school students on 24.11.2022 and 25.11.2022 at GKD Auditorium. The competition was conducted for school students in Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya Campus distinctively and students from outside Vidyalaya campus. Programme Details:

Sri Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya College of Education has initiated **Active Learning Programme** for the students studying in Sri Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya Swami Shivananda Higher Secondary School (Girls Wing) on 13.07.2022. The students studying in classes 6th to 8th are engaged in Active learning classes by applying active learning strategies in the teaching learning process of Mathematics and Science subjects and extended to 9th students as well.






