Swachh Bharat Activities 2021 – 2022

Sri Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya College of Education (Autonomous) conducted а one day Swachh Bharat Activity at Palamalai, Periyanaickenpalayam on 30.04.2022. First the College of Education got prior permission from both the Forest Office and Temple In-charge. On the day (30.04.2022) morning 8:15 am, the student teacher and staff concern departure from the college by using buses and bikes. The team reached at Palamalai foot Hill approximately 9.15 am and parked their vehicles near the Forest Checkpost. In total 40 students and staff involved in the Swachh activity. Two Forest Department Staff, Mr. Muthu (Forester, Forest Range office, Karamadai) and Mr. Shanmugavel (Forest Guard, Forest Range office, Periyanaickenpalayam), welcomed the team and provided a brief orientation about the forest and its uses.

After that students were divided into two groups for cleaning work. Students started to collect Plastic bags & bottles and Glass bottles from foot hill to Sri Aranganathar temple. After the small break again continued to collect the plastics in and around the temple. In total, the team cleaned 4.5 km of the hill's road side and the temple premises, collecting 13 large bags of plastic, Glass bottles, and other waste materials. 


