Sri Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya College of Education (Autonomous) conducted DEEKSHARAMBH - Student Induction Programme for the student teachers admitted in Bachelor of Education (B.Ed.) Programme during the Academic Year 2022- 2023. As per the guidelines of the University Grants Commission, the programme has been conducted for ten days period from 27th October 2022 to 08th November 2022.

Objectives of the Programme

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Report Mentoring / Academic Counselling

Sri Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya College of Education has been organising Student Induction Programme for the newly admitted student-teachers to familiarise with the institution in which there is an orientation session on mentoring services. Being a mentor each teacher is allotted some students as their mentees. The college of Education has been conducting Mentor-Mentee meeting periodically to discuss about various issues and to make necessary measure to overcome the issues.

- The College of Education has a Zero Hour mentoring system where each Mentor teacher meets their mentees for discussion which assist to identify the strengths and weaknesses of the student-teachers. The problems and issues faced by the studentteachers are discussed in person with the mentor teacher through informal, open chats and discussions with them and also student-teachers may get an opportunity to report their needs through the Mentoring System functioning effectively in the college. The curriculum, syllabus, library, ICT facilities, evaluation schemes, clubs, associations, co-curricular activities, etc. are explained to all the students, especially the students with diverse needs. Personal care and attention is given to all students concerning career, personal, and vocational matters. The mentor-mentee meetings held are documented by the concerned mentor teachers in the form of Mentoring File/Register.

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Competitive Exam Coaching (TN-TET/TRB/CTET) 2023

Programme

The event began with a warm welcome address by Logeswaran B, a second-year student-teacher. He extended a hearty welcome to all the esteemed guests, including Rev. Secretary Maharaj, Principal Anna, faculty members, non-teaching staff, and fellow student-teachers. His introductory remarks set the tone for the informative session ahead.

Dr. G. Subramonian, Principal of Sri Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya College of Education, Coimbatore, delivered the presidential address. In his speech, he emphasized the significance of competitive exams in the field of education and encouraged aspiring teachers to clear these exams with dedication and perseverance. His insightful words motivated the audience and underscored the importance of the day's program.

General Overview of Competitive Exams:

A comprehensive overview of key competitive exams was provided to the attendees:

a. Tamil Nadu Teachers Recruitment Board (TRB):

This section explained the role of TRB in recruiting teachers for different levels, from Primary Teachers (Class I to V) to Upper Primary Teachers (Class VI to VIII) in various subjects. The session highlighted the nuances of eligibility criteria, exam patterns, syllabi, and the application process, all of which can vary based on specific recruitment notifications.

b. Central Teacher Eligibility Test (CTET):

The presentation provided insights into CTET, a national-level eligibility test conducted by CBSE. It caters to teachers in Central Government Schools (Kendriya Vidyalayas) and schools under Union Territories. The exam structure for Paper-I (Classes I to V) and Paper-II (Classes VI to VIII) was detailed, along with the subjects tested.

Preparation Guidelines:

This section provided valuable advice to B.Ed. students preparing for these competitive

exams:

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Understand the Exam Pattern and Syllabus: A detailed understanding of the exam structure and syllabus is essential to plan preparation effectively.

Collect Study Materials: Gathering relevant study materials, textbooks, and previous years' question papers was emphasized. Additionally, the use of preparation guides and online resources was recommended.

Create a Study Plan: Attendees were encouraged to devise a study schedule that allocates time wisely for each subject and topic.

Practice Mock Tests: Regular mock tests and solving previous years' question papers were suggested as a means to gauge the exam's difficulty level and improve time management.

Stay Updated: It was highlighted that staying informed about official notifications and any changes to the exam pattern and eligibility criteria is crucial for successful preparation.

Mock Test:

N Rajesh Kumar, Assistant Professor in Biological Science, conducted a detailed presentation on the Teacher Eligibility Tests (TET), TRB, and CTET exams. He provided a comprehensive understanding of the syllabus, exam patterns, and marking schemes for the Tamil Nadu Teacher Eligibility Test (TNTET), emphasizing that B.Ed. students are eligible for TET Paper-I. Following the presentation, a mock test was administered using the Quizizz online platform, where students used their mobile devices to participate.

Mock Test - Quizizz:

The mock test, facilitated by N Rajesh Kumar, was conducted using the Quizizz online platform. The test consisted of 20 questions related to educational topics, and all students actively participated using their mobile apps.

The awareness program was a significant success, as it not only provided valuable insights into competitive exams but also allowed students to practice their knowledge through the mock test. The event was informative and motivating, helping aspiring

chem to better prepare for their future careers.


