

Competitive Exam Coaching (TN-TET/ TRB/CTET) 2023

Programme

The event began with a warm welcome address by Logeswaran B, a second-year student-teacher. He extended a hearty welcome to all the esteemed guests, including Rev. Secretary Maharaj, Principal Anna, faculty members, non-teaching staff, and fellow student-teachers. His introductory remarks set the tone for the informative session ahead.

Dr. G. Subramonian, Principal of Sri Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya College of Education, Coimbatore, delivered the presidential address. In his speech, he emphasized the significance of competitive exams in the field of education and encouraged aspiring teachers to clear these exams with dedication and perseverance. His insightful words motivated the audience and underscored the importance of the day's program.

General Overview of Competitive Exams:

A comprehensive overview of key competitive exams was provided to the attendees:

a. Tamil Nadu Teachers Recruitment Board (TRB):

This section explained the role of TRB in recruiting teachers for different levels, from Primary Teachers (Class I to V) to Upper Primary Teachers (Class VI to VIII) in various subjects. The session highlighted the nuances of eligibility criteria, exam patterns, syllabi, and the application process, all of which can vary based on specific recruitment notifications.

b. Central Teacher Eligibility Test (CTET):

The presentation provided insights into CTET, a national-level eligibility test conducted by CBSE. It caters to teachers in Central Government Schools (Kendriya Vidyalayas) and schools under Union Territories. The exam structure for Paper-I (Classes I to V) and Paper-II (Classes VI to VIII) was detailed, along with the subjects tested.

Create a Study Plan: Attendees were encouraged to devise a study schedule that allocates time wisely for each subject and topic.

Practice Mock Tests: Regular mock tests and solving previous years' question papers were suggested as a means to gauge the exam's difficulty level and improve time management.

Stay Updated: It was highlighted that staying informed about official notifications and any changes to the exam pattern and eligibility criteria is crucial for successful preparation.

Mock Test:

N Rajesh Kumar, Assistant Professor in Biological Science, conducted a detailed presentation on the Teacher Eligibility Tests (TET), TRB, and CTET exams. He provided a comprehensive understanding of the syllabus, exam patterns, and marking schemes for the Tamil Nadu Teacher Eligibility Test (TNTET), emphasizing that B.Ed. students are eligible for TET Paper-I. Following the presentation, a mock test was administered using the Quizizz online platform, where students used their mobile devices to participate.

Mock Test - Quizizz:

The mock test, facilitated by N Rajesh Kumar, was conducted using the Quizizz online platform. The test consisted of 20 questions related to educational topics, and all students actively participated using their mobile apps.

The awareness program was a significant success, as it not only provided valuable insights into competitive exams but also allowed students to practice their knowledge through the mock test. The event was informative and motivating, helping aspiring

The CCE Programme report is an important tool for parents, teachers, and students of the programme report is an identify areas for improvement. It is designed to be

Keynote about EMIS:



Stimulation of Analytical Thinking through Mathematics among School Students

Introduction:

Analytical thinking is a crucial skill that enables individuals to approach complex problems and challenges by breaking them down into smaller parts, analyzing them, and then putting them back together to form a solution. It is an essential skill for students to develop, as it helps them think critically and creatively, and it is useful in various academic and professional pursuits. In recognition of the importance of analytical thinking skills, Sri Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya College of Education initiated classes to develop these skills among school students.

Objectives:

- To promote analytical thinking skills among students from the sixth standard to the ninth standard.
- ➢ To enhance the pedagogical abilities of B.Ed. Student teachers and faculty members in delivering Mathematics education that stimulates analytical thinking.
- To create a competency-based educational approach that seamlessly incorporates analytical thinking strategies into the teaching of Mathematics.
- > To establish a nurturing and participative learning setting that encourages teamwork, creativity and the development of problem-solving abilities
- To appraise students' advancements and offer them feedback by employing evaluation and feedback methods.



Methodology:

a) Curriculum Integration:

A team of Mathematics educators, and experts and analytical thinking collaborates to integrate analytical thinking skills in existing curriculum that aligns with the national educational standards and promotes higher order thinking skills. The curriculum incorporates interactive teaching methods, problem-solving activities, and real-world applications of Mathematics.

b) Teacher Training:

Student teachers and faculty members received specialized training in instructional strategies that foster analytical thinking in Mathematics. The training included periodical workshops and orientations to equip teachers with the necessary skills to implement the programme effectively.

c) Implementation:

The programme implemented in campus schools, covering students from the first standard to the ninth standard. Teachers deliver the curriculum using a student-centered approach, encouraging active participation, critical thinking and analytical reasoning. The lessons designed to engage students in challenging problem-solving tasks and promote higher-order thinking skills.

d) Assessment and Feedback:

Ongoing assessment tools, such as formative and summative assessments, utilized to monitor students' progress and provide feedback.



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The primary goal of Analytical Thinking classes is to develop analytical thinking skill among school students through teaching Mathematical concepts. Mathematical abilities are essential because they provide structure for rationally solving problems. It helps in the conceptualization of several areas that include verbal components such as numerical knowledge, counting and reasoning as well as non-verbal components such as Mathematical notation, reasoning in time and space, calculation, and so on.

Mathematical exercises such as puzzles, riddles, and open-ended inquiries, finding patterns, brainstorming ideas, analysing data, and making situational decisions among students were planned and executed. Application of analytical thinking components paves the way for enhancing the IQ levels. It supports the growth of pupils' critical and creative thinking. It teaches children how to think differently in a diverse range of situations. Utilization of advanced technology in analytical classes stimulates the interest, curiosity and helps pupils to familiarize Mathematical concepts easily.

Phase I : Trainer Training Programme:

Regular Trainer's Training Programme on Stimulating Analytical Thinking through Mathematics is conducted for student teachers and question paper setters. The Programme coordinated by Sri. V. Eswaran, Assistant Professor in Mathematics and organized by the Internal Quality Assurance Cell, Sri Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya College of Education.

The programme has been designed to introduce teaching strategies and syllabus related to stimulating analytical thinking through Mathematics. It will cover various topics including the introduction to Moodle (LMS), hands-on training in Google Sheet, Google quiz and question bank preparation using various resources. The aim of the programme is to equip Student – teachers and Research scholars with the necessary skills and knowledge to promote analytical thinking and problem-solving abilities among school students through Mathematics.



Phase – II : Implementation of Programme

Sri Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya College of Education initiated organising the Classes on "Stimulation of Analytical Thinking through Mathematics among School Students" for sixth grade students to ninth grade students of Sri Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya Swami Shivananda Higher Secondary School. Student-Teachers from Sri Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya College of Education and Ph.D Scholars from Department of Mathematics, Sri Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya College of Arts and Science has been handling the Analytical Thinking Classes weekly once for a period of 45 minutes duration. Analytical Thinking Tests were conducted through online mode twice in a month to assess pupils' progress. The programme coordinated by Sri. V. Eswaran, Assistant Professor in Mathematics.





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

Awareness Programme on Communicating with Persons of Different Disabilities

The objective of the programme is to create an awareness among studentteachers on communicating with persons of different disabilities. The programme was organised on 24.02.2023. The special address was delivered by Dr. K. Rajamanickam, Assistant Professor in IEVH. It can provide training in communicating with individuals who use Braille, Sign language, or speech as their primary means of communication. The following are some key components that could be included in an awareness programme on communicating with persons of different disabilities:

- Understanding different types of disabilities: The programme gave an overview of the different types of disabilities that people may have, including physical, sensory, cognitive, and intellectual disabilities. This helps individuals better understand the challenges that people with disabilities face and how to interact with them in an appropriate and respectful way.
- Braille training: For individuals who interact with individuals whoare visually impaired, the programme gave an introduction to braille and how it works. This includes basic training on how to read and write braille, as well as tips on how to communicate effectively with someone who uses braille.
- Sign language training: For individuals who interact with individuals who are deaf or hard of hearing, the programme provided and introduction to sign language and how it works. This includes basic training on how to sign common words and phrases, as well as tips on how to communicate effectively with someone who uses sign language.

Speech training: For individuals who interact with individuals whohave speech impairments, the program provided an introduction to different types of speech impairments and how they affect communication. Workshop on Information and Communication Technology for Inclusive Education

A one-day workshop on Information and Communication Technology for Inclusive Education (Universal Design for Learning) was organised by Sri Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya College of Education on 28th April 2023 (Friday). The main objective of the workshop was to explore the transformative factors in classroom practices that support inclusion with Information and Communication Technology. The programme started with invocation by Sri. R. Amarnath Venkatraman, Music Teacher (Performing Arts) of the College. Sri M. Poornachandran, B.Ed. I Year Student-teacher welcomed the gathering. Dr. G. Subramonian, Principal of the College delivered the Presidential Address. Sri S.Shankar Subbiah, Consultant in Agate Infotek, Specialist in Assistive Technology and Accessibility, Chennai acted as a Resource Person. His session focused on workshop practices that enhance the skills of teachers in schools and educational institutions. He discussed the topics on Multi-tiered System of Support (MTSS), Rights of Persons with Disability Act (2016), National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC), Sector Skill Council for Persons with Disability (SCPWD), NCERT's PRASHAST Application, and Unique Disability Identity Card (UDID). He also highlighted the importance of ensuring accessibility in school infrastructure for students with disabilities.

In the second session he discussed different types of disabilities among school students and the corresponding teaching remedies. The session explored various applications and schemes designed for persons with disabilities. The disabilities covered included visual impairments, hearing impairments, gross motor skill difficulties, and fine motor skill difficulties. The resource person shared insights into screening processes, software applications, assistive devices, and tools to support students with that included Tactile Graphics, Talkback, Braille Machines, EPUB3

Reader, Smart Cane, JA WS, and NVDA.

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In the afternoon session practical demonstrations of Braille instruments and applications for visually impaired students were discussed by which the participants learned about handling Braille gadgets and explored ways to teach visually impaired students effectively. Additionally, the session delved into assessments of gross motor skills and fine motor skills. Various assistive devices such as exoskeletons, Sym biotic Leg, and capturing apps were introduced to aid individuals with mobility difficulties. Finally, Sri. R. Prabathasuriyan, B.Ed. I Year Student-teacher proposed vote of thanks. The programme ended with National Anthem at 4.00 p.m. From this workshop all the student-teachers get to know about the information of disability students along with the scheme and technology available for them to make involve them self in education as well as physical work.



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Report on Educational Exhibition

The Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya organises 'Gurupuja' (a communitylinked socio-cultural function) Celebrations on the first Sunday of every year.
