#### Kargil Vijay Diwas



#### **August Kranti Diwas**



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
# Birth Anniversary of Veerapandiya Kattabomman and Rani Velu Nachiyar







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#### 5. Awareness Programme on Inclusive Classroom

Jagadesh, Assistant Professor in Education welcomed and introduced the Resource Person Dr. M. She demonstrated the inclusive setup in the classroom and made the student-teachers empathise the challenges of visually challenged persons through simulated activity.

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#### 6. Remedial Coaching

- below average students through remedial coaching. The students with low performance are identified from their level of understanding concepts and performance in the continuous internal assessments conducted by the college. After the first internal examinations, the Subject Teachers concerned in association with Principal sort out those students who are in need of additional support for the improvement in academics.
- Two student-teachers namely Sri S. Aurobindo and Sri A. Murali (2022 2024 Batch) have been identified and given remedial teaching in the concerned subjects without affecting the regular class hours. Pedagogical faculty members concerned clarify the doubts of the below average students and handled special classes and provide immediate feedback.
- The intervention practices like breaking the concept into small parts, using mind maps, flow charts, mnemonics, concept maps, individualised instruction to teach the concept, engage students in learning process, providing feedback on performance, re-teaching the difficult concepts are applied to enhance the academic performance. Also, the college provides conducive environment, infrastructure and access to technology for enriching students' learning.
- The College of Education created a Blog in which the faculty members uploaded teaching learning materials for the student-teachers to equip their knowledge and it paves the way to provide remedial coaching to the needy student-teachers.

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#### 7. Mentoring

Sri Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya College of Education has been organising Student Induction Programme for the newly admitted student- teachers to familiarize with the institution in which there is an orientation session on mentoring services. Being a mentor, each teacher is allotted some students as their mentees. The college of Education has been conducting Mentor- Mentee meeting periodically to discuss about various issues and to make necessary measure to overcome the issues.

The College of Education has a Zero Hour mentoring system where each Mentor teacher meets their mentees for discussion which assist to identify the strengths and weaknesses of the student-teachers. The problems and issues faced by the student-teachers are discussed in person with the mentor teacher through informal, open chats and discussions with them and also student-teachers may get an opportunity to report their needs through the Mentoring System functioning effectively in the college. The curriculum, syllabus, library, ICT facilities, evaluation schemes, clubs, associations, co-curricular activities, etc. are explained to all the students, especially the students with diverse needs. Personal care and attention is given to all students concerning career, personal, and vocational matters. The mentor-mentee meetings held are documented by the concerned mentor teachers in the form of Mentoring Record/File.

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#### Code of Conduct for Teaching and Non-teaching Staff

- Staff shall discharge their duties efficiently and diligently to match with the academic standards and performance norms lay down by the College Management from time to time.
- 2. Staff shall update their knowledge and skills to equip them professionally for the proper discharge of duties assigned to them.
- 3. Staff shall conduct themselves with absolute dignity and decorum in dealing with the superiors, colleagues and students every time.
- 4. Staff shall not absent from duties at any time without prior permission from authorities concerned.
- Staff shall not associate with any political party or take part in any other organizational activity, which is not in line with the duties and ethics of the teaching profession.
- Staff shall not attempt to bring any political or outside pressure on their superior authorities in respect of service matters.
- Staff shall not participate in any strike or demonstration and /or indulge in any criticism of College Management policy or of the Government for any reason whatsoever.
- Staff shall not act in any manner that violates the norms of decency or morality in their conduct or behaviour inside and outside the College Campus.

- All the students are expected to be present in the class well within time. Late coming will also result in loss of attendance for the corresponding hour.
- Students should get up from their seat when the teacher enters the classroom and remain standing till the teacher takes his seat or they are allowed by the teacher to sit. Silence shall be observed during class.
- No student shall enter or leave the class room when the session is on without the permission of the teacher concerned.
- All the students are expected to attend college functions in college uniform unless otherwise specified.
- All the students shall wear their identity card.
- 7. Students are encouraged to make use of the library, common computing facilities and to involve in professional body activities or any programme authorized by the college beyond class hours however under normal circumstances students shall retreat to their hostel for residence by 6:00 p.m.

- 11. Students shall carefully handle the furniture, equipment, fixtures and appliance of the college and lab. Careless handling/ misuse of the above could result personal injuries or damages to property.
- 12. Students are not permitted to arrange any unauthorised celebrations and decorations of any magnitude in the campus.
- 13. Students are not permitted to disturb or display (both physical and electronically) material such as notices, banners etc. in the campus without the permission of the competent authority.
- 14. Students are expected to make use of academic, co-curricular and extracurricular facilities available to the optimum levels. This will certainly make them physically fit, academically competent, mentally alert and socially sensitive.
- 15. On duty leave applications will not be entertained beyond 10 working days from the actual date of leave under any circumstance. The maximum number of on duty leave admissible is restricted to 10 days per semester
- 16. During internal examinations of 1 hour and 3 hour period, students are not allowed to leave the hall within ½ an hour from the beginning of the examination and students have to occupy the seat 5 minutes before the commencement of the examination.
- 17. Political activity in any form is not permitted in the college campus. Unauthorised meetings, propaganda, processions or fund collections are forbidden within the college, hostels and outside of the college.
- 18. Harassing juniors, ill treatment to other fellow students or any such form of ragging is objectionable and liable to be treated as criminal offence by the law enforcing agencies as per the directives of Honourable Supreme Court of India.
- 19. Expulsion from the college leads to expulsion from the hostel as well.
- 20. If there is a case against a student for a possible breach of code of conduct, then a committee will be formed to recommend suitable disciplinary action who shall inquire into the alleged violation and accordingly suggest the action to be taken against the said student. The committee may meet with the student to ascertain the time the misconduct and suggest one or more of the following disciplinary actions

based on the nature of conduct.

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- 21. Community service For a specified period of time is to be extended if need to be. However, any future misconduct along with failure to comply with any conditions imposed may lead to severe disciplinary action, including suspension or expulsion.
- 22. Expulsion Expulsion of a student from the institute permanently. Indicating prohibition from entering the Institute premises or participating in any student related activities or campus residence, etc.
- 23. Monetary penalty May also include suspension or forfeiture of scholarship/ fellowship for a specific time period.
- 24. Suspension- A student may be suspended for a specified period of time which will entail prohibition in participating the students related activities, classes, programmes etc. Additional, the students will be forbidden to use various Institute facilities unless permission is obtained from the competent authority. Suspension may also follow by possible dismissal, along with the following additional penalties. 








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# 3. National Conference on National Education Policy (NEP-2020) Opportunities and Challenges in Teacher Education











## 6. Orientation on mobilizing relevant and varied learning resources




