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
Case 2 - Intellectual Development Practices


A quiz is a mind game in which learners (as individuals or in teams) attempt to answer questions correctly. Quizzes are usually scored in points and many are designed to determine a winner from a group of participants. This gives the teacher an instant idea of what learners already know about the topic. Quizzes can be used to revise learners' retention of previous lessons or at the end of a lesson. This allows the teacher to get feedback on learners' progression.

In an educational context, quizzes are used to test learners' understanding of the key concepts covered in each chapter also it is sometimes used to assess learners' intellectual quotient. Considering the significance of quizzes, the College of Education has conducted quiz competitions in various occasions for the cognitive development of the student- teachers. 






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Case 3 - Educational Exhibition on Active Learning Methodology

During this occasion an exhibition is put up by Sri -Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya College of Education on the title "Active Learning Methodology" to bring awareness among the students, teachers, academicians and common people about various active learning strategies followed in 21st century. In the Education Exhibition organised in 01st January 2023 Active Learning Methodology, an innovative teaching learning methodology and various strategies were portrayed in the form of posters and student-teachers of our college designed displayed the models.
