1. Organising Learning (Lesson Plan)

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Report

Orientation on Preparation of Lesson Plan

Sri Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya College of Education (Autonomous) organised an Orientation Programme on Preparation of Lesson Plan on 19.07.2022. The aim of the orientation was to help student-teachers learn the process of preparing effective lesson plans and aligning them with the learning outcomes and instructional objectives. The session was conducted by Dr. K. Karthigeyan, Assistant Professor in Education of the college. The programme started with welcome address by Sri. B. Soundar Rajan, Student-Teacher (B.Ed. II Year) of the college. The session was conducted by Dr. K. Karthigeyan, who explained the format of the lesson plan and its components. He discussed the importance of including the learning objectives, activities, assessment methods, and evaluation in a lesson plan. He also provided examples of lesson plans for different subjects and explained how to prepare a lesson plan for a class. He emphasized the importance of aligning the lesson plan with the learning outcomes and instructional objectives.

In the second session, the student-teachers were divided into groups based on their respective subjects. Subject specific teachers trained the student-teachers in preparing lesson plans for their subjects. The subject specific teachers provided insights on how to tailor a lesson plan to meet the requirements of the specific subject and its related learning objectives. The student-teachers actively participated in the training and prepared lesson plans for their respective subjects with the help of subject specific teachers.

Dr. K. Karthigeyan provided feedback and suggestions for improvement. He emphasised the importance of using a variety of teaching aids and techniques in lesson planning. He also discussed how a lesson plan should be flexible and adaptable based on the students' needs and learning outcomes.



The programme concluded with a vote of thanks by Sri. M. Kailas Guru, Student-Teacher (B.Ed. II Year). He thanked Dr. K. Karthigeyan for his informative session and appreciated the student-teachers for their active participation. He also urged the student-teachers to implement the knowledge gained during the programme in their future teaching practices.

The orientation on Lesson Plan Preparation was a well-organized and informative event for the student-teachers. The programme provided a detailed understanding of the components and importance of lesson planning, and practical training on how to prepare lesson plans for different subjects. The programme would undoubtedly help the student-teachers to prepare effective lesson plans in the future, and ultimately lead to better learning outcomes for the students.

2. Developing Teaching Competencies

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Report

Developing Teaching Competencies

(i) Orientation on Micro Teaching and Skill Practices

Micro-teaching is a widely used instructional technique in teacher education programme. It allows B.Ed. student-teachers to develop and enhance their teaching skills in a controlled and supportive environment. It provides the student-teachers to obtain an understanding and to enhance their teaching competency before they go for real teaching in their internship schools. An orientation programme on micro teaching was conducted from 30.11.2022 to 02.12.2022 and the practice sessions were organised from 05.12.2022 to 09.12.2022 for the first year B.Ed. student-teachers admitted in the academic year 2022-2023. On the first day, the faculty in-charge explained the micro teaching, needs, steps and procedures to be followed during the practice of micro teaching. All the subject specific faculty members involved in the micro teaching and demonstrated the micro skills in a specific content and explained how to write the episode in a right way. This direction lined the way for the studentteachers to get a clear idea on each skill considered necessary for micro teaching. Then, the student-teachers started writing the episodes with respect to each skill in terms of practicing all the skills required. They practiced teaching in groups after getting the episodes corrected from the pedagogy teachers. In the course of practice sessions, each student-teacher got a chance to practice the skills and so all the student-teachers got benefitted towards the enhancement of their learning. The following skills were practiced under the observation of the faculty members and peer student-teachers: (i) Skill of introducing a lesson, (ii) Skill of fluency in questioning, (iii) Skill of explaining, (iv) Skill of stimulus variation, (v) Skill of reinforcement, (vi) Skill of illustrating with examples, (vii) Skill of using blackboard, and (viii) Skill of increasing pupil participation. Based on the feedback, the skills were re-practiced by the the student-teachers.

(ii) Internship Training - Phase I: Orientation and Observation

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School Internship is an important part of the B.Ed. curriculum. School internship is designed to lead to development of a broad repertoire of perspectives, professional capacities, teacher sensibilities and skills. It is an opportunity for the practicing teachers to develop the required skills and methods of teaching. Before the commencement of the Internship Training Phase-I (13.02.2023 to 10.03.2023), the pedagogy teachers oriented the importance of VIDYALAVA

observation and explained the steps of observation classes in the internship schools. Based upon the instruction given by the faculty members concerned the student-teachers observed the school teachers classroom teaching and recorded in their record note books, and submitted to the respective faculty members. This helped the student-teachers to know how to incorporate various teaching skills in the real classroom, classroom management, application of different methods, teaching aids and create a good atmosphere in the classroom.

(iii) Internship Training-Phase II: Demonstration, Practice and Observation

Before the commencement of the Practice Teaching Phase-II (01.08.2022 to 02.12.2022) for the second year student-teachers, the faculty members in specific subject areas gave a demonstration lessons for each of the two optional subjects offered by the college. All the student-teachers attended the preparatory demonstration classes and clarified their doubts to the faculty members related to teaching. Then the student-teachers also demonstrated a model class for both optional subjects in their pedagogy period. After getting feedbacks and suggestions from their pedagogy teacher, they have undergone their internship training in the allotted schools. The faculty members made observations of the student-teachers teaching, lesson plans, teaching aids, and other related activities. Also, they provided feedbacks to improve their teaching learning process.



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3. Assessment of Learning

(i) Orientation on CCE amd EMIS

An Orientation Programme on Continuous and Comprehensive Evaluation (CCE) and Educational Management Information System (EMIS) was organised by the College of Education on 28th July 2022. Dr. M. Jagadesh, Assistant Professor in Education explained the importance of Continuous and Comprehensive Evaluation in schools and how to assess the students' scholastic and non-scholastic performance in an effective way. Sri. V. Eswaran, Assistant Professor in Mathematics and Sri. N. Rajesh Kumar, Assistant Professor in Biological Science explained the significance of the EMIS School Portal, Teacher Portal and Student Exam Portal and demonstrated using TNSED App. It was very unique and essential for student-teachers to know about salient features of EMIS portal before going to internship training.

(ii) Workshop on Tools of Assessment

The workshop on Tools of Assessment for Learning was organised by the college on 23.07.2022 and 30.07.2022. The purpose of the workshop is to create tools for assessing students learning in schools. Dr. M. Jagadesh, Assistant Professor in Education explained about Teacher made Written Tests, Dr. K. Karthigeyan, Dr. R. Ayyappan, and Sri. V. Eswaran, Assistant Professors of the College explained the observation modes for individual and group activities. Dr. K. Karthigeyan handled a session on how to conduct performance tests and motivated student-teachers to prepare rubrics for assessment. Dr. N.N. Prapakaran, described the preparation of rubrics for oral assessment. Dr. P. Vel Murugan explained about the rating scales and encouraged the student-teachers to prepare sample questionnaire for assessing study skills, study involvement and study habit of school students. The student-teachers prepared the above said tools individually and groups and utilised these tools in schools for assessing the students learning. This workshop created research attitude among the student-teachers.



(ii) Orientation on STEM Lab

On the 5th of April 2023, the B.Ed. students of Sri Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya College of Education were given an orientation on STEM lab by Sri. N. Rajesh Kumar, Assistant Professor in Biological Science. The session was conducted in the newly established STEM lab of the college.

The orientation began with a brief introduction to Infosys Springboard, a platform that offers learning solutions for students and professionals. He explained the concept of Olabs, Vlabs and PhET, which are online laboratories designed to provide students with hands-on experience in Science and Engineering. The Olabs provide simulations for Physics, Chemistry and Biology experiments, whereas the Vlabs provide virtual labs for engineering subjects. PhET is an interactive simulation platform that allows students to simulate experiments in Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Earth Science and Mathematics.

After explaining the features of these platforms, he gave the students instructions on how to prepare video content using PhET and Olabs. The students were encouraged to be creative and to make their videos engaging and informative. The students were given some time to work on their videos, with the resource person moving around the lab to offer guidance and support where needed. The students showed a lot of enthusiasm and interest in creating their videos, and they worked diligently on them.

Finally, the students shared their videos on blogs and WhatsApp groups, allowing their peers to view and offer feedback. The videos were well received, and the students were praised for their efforts. Overall, the orientation on STEM lab was a successful learning experience for the B.Ed. students of Sri Ramakrishna Mission VIDVAVIdvalaya College of Education. The STEM lab provided them with the necessary resources to learn and practice Science and Engineering concepts The Resource

Person's guidance was instrumental in ensuring that the students understood the platforms' features and how to use them effectively. The students' creativity and enthusiasm in creating their videos showcased their potential as future educators in the field of Science and Technology.

(i) Field Visit on Gass Forest Museum

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Report

Field Visit - Gass Forest Museum

Introduction

Sri Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya College of Education organised a field trip for the student-teachers to Gass Forest Museum in Coimbatore on 27th April 2023. The purpose of the trip was to provide practical exposure to student-teachers and enhance their understanding of environmental science, biodiversity, and conservation efforts. Dr. N.N. Prapakaran, Coordinator, Department of Extension Services, obtained permission from the Director of Gass Forest Museum a week prior to the visit, ensuring a smooth and well organised trip.

Objectives

- To provide students with an opportunity to observe and learn about biodiversity, and conservation efforts.
- To understand wildlife, geological samples, entomological specimens, timber and non-timber forest produce, tribal armaments, and forest engineering models.
- To provide opportunity to gain experiential learning environment.

Under the guidance of Dr. N.N. Prapakaran, a group of student-teachers studying first and second year of B.Ed. programme in Sri Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya College of Education visited Gass Forest Museum on the scheduled day. The museum is renowned for South India's largest collection of forestry artefacts including timber and non-timber forest produce, geological samples, tribal armaments and ornaments, entomological specimens and forest engineering models, which provided an ideal learning environment for the student teachers.

About Gass Forest Museum

Gass Forest Museum is a natural history museum situated at Coimbatore, Tamil Nadu. It is the first institution in India to house exhibits related to forestry. This



government run museum is located in the verdant Forest College Campus on Cowley Brown Road. It is housed in a heritage building that is over a century old. It is one of the oldest buildings in Coimbatore and it is over 100 years old, in a way the museum building itself is a heritage site. Museum is within Forest college campus grounds and it feels like a mini forest within the city. Apart from wildlife the exhibits include Arms used in olden days, wood crafts, huge collection of insects, cultural artifacts and many more. Main Attractions are the Preserved and stuffed animals, birds and reptiles.

It was established in 1902 by H.A. Gass, the then Conservator of Forests of Coimbatore circle. Gass conceived the idea of starting a museum to represent various aspects of forestry though a comprehensive collection. It was started in one of the rooms of the conservator's office building and was extended to the verandah and some other portions of the District Forest Office. The present building built in 1915. It is made of red stone and built in British Gothic style. The ventilation is such that light spreads throughout the hall. The folding in the four corners give the building the strength to withstand perpendicular seismic impact, if any. The iron pillars in the hall were imported from Britain. During World War II, the museum was closed to accommodate evacuees from Greece and Malta.

There are about 4000 exhibits presently on display at the Gass Forest Museum. The exhibits on display at the museum cover various disciplines in Science and Geography like Botany, Zoology, and Geology etc. Of the rare artifacts in the museum is a piece of asteroid which is believed to be several million years old, a full grown male stuffed Indian guar which would have weighed over a ton when alive and a stuffed albino crow. At present the numbers of insects which have been preserved here are more than 1200 and are growing slowly. This museum seems attractive to people of all age groups as often youth can be spotted posing in front of the Indian Gaur, young children roaring at the preserved leopard and elderly studying the exhibits with deep thoughts. The artefacts in the departments namely Wildlife, Botany, Timber, Non-Timber, Geology, Ethnology, Mycology, Forest Engineering Entomology and Woodcrafts were observed in the Gass Forest Museum.



Activities

- Orientation: Upon arrival, the students were greeted by the Director of the Museum, who provided a brief orientation about the museum's history, collections, and notable exhibits. This introduction set the context for the subsequent activities.
- *Museum Visit:* The student-teachers were divided into smaller groups, each led by an experienced guide. The guides took them on a comprehensive visit to various sections of the museum, explaining the significance of the sections like ethnology section, skeleton section, entomology section and mycology section etc.
- *Interactive Sessions:* Throughout the visit, the student-teachers actively engaged with the guides, asking questions and seeking further clarification on specific pieces. The interactive sessions allowed the student-teachers to develop deeper into the subject matter and gain a better understanding of the biological and artistic aspects represented in the museum.
- *Reflection and Discussions*: After the visit, the student-teachers gathered for a group discussion, facilitated by Dr. N.N. Prapakaran. They shared their observations, reflections, and insights gained from the museum visit. This session allowed them to exchange ideas, broaden their perspectives, and explore potential applications of the learning experience in their future teaching endeavors.










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(iv) Educational Exhibition <u>Report on Educational Exhibition – Gurupuja 2023</u> (Active Learning Methodology)







Outcomes of the Programme


- Students who have attended coaching classes showed better academic performance, benefitting from targeted support and personalised instruction in the tuition classes.





(i) <u>Awareness Programme on Communicating with Persons</u> <u>of Different Disabilities</u>

The objective of the programme is to create an awareness among student*eachers on communicating with persons of different disabilities. The programme was organised on 24.02.2023. The special address was delivered by Dr. K. Rajamanickam, Assistant Professor in IEVH. It can provide training in communicating with individuals who use Braille, Sign language, or speech as their primary means of communication. The following are some key components that could be included in an awareness programme on communicating with persons of different disabilities:

- Understanding different types of disabilities: The programme gave an overview of the different types of disabilities that people may have, including physical, sensory, cognitive, and intellectual disabilities. This helps individuals better understand the challenges that people with disabilities face and how to interact with them in an appropriate and respectful way.
- Braille training: For individuals who interact with individuals whoare visually impaired, the programme gave an introduction to braille and how it works. This includes basic training on how to read and write braille, as well as tips on how to communicate effectively with someone who uses braille.



(ii) Workshop on Information and Communication Technology <u>for Inclusive Education</u>

A one-day workshop on Information and Communication Technology for Inclusive Education (Universal Design for Learning) was organised by Sri Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya College of Education on 28th April 2023 (Friday). The main objective of the workshop was to explore the transformative factors in classroom practices that support inclusion with Information and Communication Technology. The programme started with invocation by Sri. R. Amarnath Venkatraman, Music Teacher (Performing Arts) of the College. Sri M. Poornachandran, B.Ed. I Year Student-teacher welcomed the gathering. Dr. G. Subramonian, Principal of the College delivered the Presidential Address. Sri S.Shankar Subbiah, Consultant in Agate Infotek, Specialist in Assistive Technology and Accessibility, Chennai acted as a Resource Person. His session focused on workshop practices that enhance the skills of teachers in schools and educational institutions. He discussed the topics on Multi-tiered System of Support (MTSS), Rights of Persons with Disability Act (2016), National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC), Sector Skill Council for Persons with Disability (SCPWD), NCERT's PRASHAST Application, and Unique Disability Identity Card (UDID). He also highlighted the importance of ensuring accessibility in school infrastructure for students with disabilities.

In the second session he discussed different types of disabilities among school students and the corresponding teaching remedies. The session explored various applications and schemes designed for persons with disabilities. The disabilities covered included visual impairments, hearing impairments, gross motor skill difficulties, and fine motor skill difficulties. The resource person shared insights into screening processes, software applications, assistive devices, and tools to support students with that included Tactile Graphics, Talkback, Braille Machines, EPUB3

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Reader, Smart Cane, JAWS, and NVDA.

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In the afternoon session practical demonstrations of Braille instruments and applications for visually impaired students were discussed by which the participants learned about handling Braille gadgets and explored ways to teach visually impaired students effectively. Additionally, the session delved into assessments of gross motor skills and fine motor skills. Various assistive devices such as exoskeletons, Sym biotic Leg, and capturing apps were introduced to aid individuals with mobility difficulties. Finally, Sri. R. Prabathasuriyan, B.Ed. I Year Student-teacher proposed vote of thanks. The programme ended with National Anthem at 4.00 p.m. From this workshop all the student-teachers get to know about the information of disability students along with the scheme and technology available for them to make involve them self in education as well as physical work.
