#### **Results**

- 1. Among the 16 student-teachers, 14 student-teachers scored above 70% of marks in the academic activities.
- 2. 05 student-teachers scored above 70% of marks in the usage of library.
- 3. 13 student-teachers scored above 70% of marks in the extension activities.
- 4. All the student-teachers scored above 70% of marks in the other responsible activities or performance in events.
- 5. 06 student-teachers scored above 70% of marks in the self-study course.
- 6. None of them scored above 70% of marks in the seminar participation and presentation.
- 7. 12 student-teachers scored 70% of marks in overall performance.

It is revealed from the assessment results that student-teachers' performance in academic activities that includes attendance, ICT Integration, seminar presentation, submission of assignment, performance in test /examination and internship activities are highly satisfying. Student-teachers' involvement and contribution in extension activities and community services like handling tuitions for downtrodden students in adopted villages, Swachh Bharat / Swachh Vidyalaya activities and their participation in various forums are extraordinary.

All the student-teachers' performance in other academic activities and responsibilities in carrying out various activities are highly satisfying. 



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#### Results

- 1. Among the 22 student-teachers, 19 student-teachers scored above 70% of marks in the academic activities.
- 2. None of them scored above 70% of marks in the usage of library.
- 3. 18 student-teachers scored above 70% of marks in the extension activities.
- 4. 19 student-teachers scored above 70% of marks in the other responsible activities or performance in events.
- 5. 06 student-teachers scored above 70% of marks in the self-study course.
- 6. None of them scored above 70% of marks in the seminar participation and presentation.
- 7. 10 student-teachers scored 70% of marks in overall performance.

It is revealed from the assessment results that student-teachers' performance in academic activities that includes attendance, ICT Integration in teaching learning process, seminar presentation, submission of assignment, performance in test / examination and internship activities are highly satisfying.

Majority of the Student-teachers' involvement and contribution in extension activities and community services like handling tuitions for downtrodden students in adopted villages, Swachh Bharat / Swachh Vidyalaya activities and their participation in various forums are also highly satisfying. The student-teachers' performance in other academic activities and responsibilities in carrying out various activities are highly satisfying. They showed the overall personality of studentteachers during the course of study as a whole.

On the other hand, student-teachers' involvement in utilisation of library resources is moderate. Though student-teachers have utilised the library resources for their academics, the level of utilisation is moderate. Similarly, minimum number of students have completed self-study courses. Though all the students have registered in various self-study courses, due to non-conduct of examinations by the concerned course organising agencies during the time of assessment they are unable to complete the self-study courses. Also, all the student-teachers have participated in seminars and webinars in various academic forums, but not engaged in presentation

part. However, through continuous motivation, guidance and mentoring from

They are motivated to present articles in seminars/ conferences even after completing the programme of study.

The overall result disclosed that the student-teachers' overall performance in all academic and other activities during the final semester in B.Ed. programme is moderate. However, all the student-teachers have been motivated to ensuring continuous improvement in their overall effectiveness in teacher profession.
