## Competitive Exam Coaching (TN-TET/ TRB/CTET) 2023

### Programme

The event began with a warm welcome address by Logeswaran B, a second-year student-teacher. He extended a hearty welcome to all the esteemed guests, including Rev. Secretary Maharaj, Principal Anna, faculty members, non-teaching staff, and fellow student-teachers. His introductory remarks set the tone for the informative session ahead.

Dr. G. Subramonian, Principal of Sri Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya College of Education, Coimbatore, delivered the presidential address. In his speech, he emphasized the significance of competitive exams in the field of education and encouraged aspiring teachers to clear these exams with dedication and perseverance. His insightful words motivated the audience and underscored the importance of the day's program.

### General Overview of Competitive Exams:

A comprehensive overview of key competitive exams was provided to the attendees:

### a. Tamil Nadu Teachers Recruitment Board (TRB):

This section explained the role of TRB in recruiting teachers for different levels, from Primary Teachers (Class I to V) to Upper Primary Teachers (Class VI to VIII) in various subjects. The session highlighted the nuances of eligibility criteria, exam patterns, syllabi, and the application process, all of which can vary based on specific recruitment notifications.

### b. Central Teacher Eligibility Test (CTET):

The presentation provided insights into CTET, a national-level eligibility test conducted by CBSE. It caters to teachers in Central Government Schools (Kendriya Vidyalayas) and schools under Union Territories. The exam structure for Paper-I (Classes I to V) and Paper-II (Classes VI to VIII) was detailed, along with the subjects tested.

### **Preparation Guidelines:**

This section provided valuable advice to B.Ed. students preparing for these competitive

exams:

Understand the Exam Pattern and Syllabus: A detailed understanding of the exam structure and syllabus is essential to plan preparation effectively.

Collect Study Materials: Gathering relevant study materials, textbooks, and previous years' question papers was emphasized. Additionally, the use of preparation guides and online resources was recommended.

Create a Study Plan: Attendees were encouraged to devise a study schedule that allocates time wisely for each subject and topic.

**Practice Mock Tests:** Regular mock tests and solving previous years' question papers were suggested as a means to gauge the exam's difficulty level and improve time management.

Stay Updated: It was highlighted that staying informed about official notifications and any changes to the exam pattern and eligibility criteria is crucial for successful preparation.

#### **Mock Test:**

N Rajesh Kumar, Assistant Professor in Biological Science, conducted a detailed presentation on the Teacher Eligibility Tests (TET), TRB, and CTET exams. He provided a comprehensive understanding of the syllabus, exam patterns, and marking schemes for the Tamil Nadu Teacher Eligibility Test (TNTET), emphasizing that B.Ed. students are eligible for TET Paper-I. Following the presentation, a mock test was administered using the Quizizz online platform, where students used their mobile devices to participate.

### Mock Test - Quizizz:

The mock test, facilitated by N Rajesh Kumar, was conducted using the Quizizz online platform. The test consisted of 20 questions related to educational topics, and all students actively participated using their mobile apps.

The awareness program was a significant success, as it not only provided valuable insights into competitive exams but also allowed students to practice their knowledge through the mock test. The event was informative and motivating, helping aspiring



## Workshop on Information and Communication Technology for Inclusive Education

A one-day workshop on Information and Communication Technology for Inclusive Education (Universal Design for Learning) was organised by Sri Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya College of Education on 28th April 2023 (Friday). The main objective of the workshop was to explore the transformative factors in classroom practices that support inclusion with Information and Communication Technology. The programme started with invocation by Sri. R. Amarnath Venkatraman, Music Teacher (Performing Arts) of the College. Sri M. Poornachandran, B.Ed. I Year Student-teacher welcomed the gathering. Dr. G. Subramonian, Principal of the College delivered the Presidential Address. Sri S.Shankar Subbiah, Consultant in Agate Infotek, Specialist in Assistive Technology and Accessibility, Chennai acted as a Resource Person. His session focused on workshop practices that enhance the skills of teachers in schools and educational institutions. He discussed the topics on Multi-tiered System of Support (MTSS), Rights of Persons with Disability Act (2016), National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC), Sector Skill Council for Persons with Disability (SCPWD), NCERT's PRASHAST Application, and Unique Disability Identity Card (UDID). He also highlighted the importance of ensuring accessibility in school infrastructure for students with disabilities.

In the second session he discussed different types of disabilities among school students and the corresponding teaching remedies. The session explored various applications and schemes designed for persons with disabilities. The disabilities covered included visual impairments, hearing impairments, gross motor skill difficulties, and fine motor skill difficulties. The resource person shared insights into screening processes, software applications, assistive devices, and tools to support students with that included Tactile Graphics, Talkback, Braille Machines, EPUB3

Reader, Smart Cane JAWS, and NVDA.

In the afternoon session practical demonstrations of Braille instruments and applications for visually impaired students were discussed by which the participants learned about handling Braille gadgets and explored ways to teach visually impaired students effectively. Additionally, the session delved into assessments of gross motor skills and fine motor skills. Various assistive devices such as exoskeletons, Sym biotic Leg, and capturing apps were introduced to aid individuals with mobility difficulties. Finally, Sri. R. Prabathasuriyan, B.Ed. I Year Student-teacher proposed vote of thanks. The programme ended with National Anthem at 4.00 p.m. From this workshop all the student-teachers get to know about the information of disability students along with the scheme and technology available for them to make involve them self in education as well as physical work.

### Report of Orientation Programme on First aid

Sri Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya College of Education (Autonomous) conducted a workshop on "First Aid" on 06.04.2023 at Sports Medicine Lab, Faculty of General and Adapted Physical Education and Yoga, Ramakrishna Mission Vivekananda Educational and Research Institute.

Sri. J. Vishnu, B.Ed I Year student-teacher delivered the welcome address and introduced the resource person, Dr. A. Sathyamoorthy, Sports Physiotherapist to the forum. Then the resource person handled the sessions effectively. He explained and demonstrated about first aid techniques. The programme is typically designed to teach participants the basic principles of administering first aid in emergency situations. The session included both theoretical and practical sessions to ensure that participants have a comprehensive understanding of the concepts.

The topics discussed in the theoretical session:

- Understanding the role and importance of first aid in emergency situations
- The different types of injuries that can occur and their associated risks
- The basic principles of assessing and managing emergencies
- The appropriate use of first aid equipment and supplies
- Communication skills and techniques required during emergencies.

Practical sessions included the following:

- Hands-on training in performing basic life support techniques such as CPR
- Demonstrations of how to administer first aid for common injuries such as cuts,
   burns and fractures
- Role-playing exercises to simulate emergency situations and practice effective communication and team work.

• Participants learnt about specialized first aid techniques, such as administering first aid to children or elderly individuals, and how to respond to emergencies in specific environments, such as in the workplace or in outdoor settings.

### Visit to Unified Play Day Programme

(Organised by General & Adapted Physical Education and Yoga (GAPEY) Ramakrishna Mission Vivekananda Educational and Research Institute)

Sri Ramakrishna Mission vidyalaya college of Education Student Teachers participated in the unified play festival on 24.02.2023 organized by GAPAEY to get awareness about Adapted Physical Education and Yoga of differently abled persons.

### Unified Play Day

The awareness about the problems and uniqueness of the differently abled has been included in all the areas of Education including research. Children and young people with disabilities continue to be one of the most disadvantaged groups in all our societies. Accepting them as they are and knowing what to-do for them is quite different thing of course. Keeping this context in mind, a set of training practice was designed exclusively for the Persons with Disabilities (PWD) who will partner with the normal students of their age. The peer group centred programme, a quality practice, "Unified Sports" an offshoot of Special Olympics which has proven efficacy in improving social interaction, confidences and self-esteem of specialchildren.

For more than fifteen years, our faculty (GAPEY) has been dedicated to provide unified mode of sports training and conduct adapted sports competition for persons with disabilities. It is a massive inclusive extension programme organized for more than 500 students every year. Functional skills of differently abled children are developed through physical activities. The teacher trainees who are trained in conducting adapted games and sports for the disabled are empowered to offer such training during their internship. The differently abled children studying in inclusive and special schools of the age group 12 – 17 years are included in the training programme. In inclusive schools, this training is provided to both differently abled and non-disabled children spread over to 20 days. After training, they are brought to the institution for exhibiting their skills before the addience.

### Unified Play Day (UPD)

The main objective of the Unified Play Day (UPD) is to provide a multifactorial approach towards children with disabilities by providing them equal opportunities that are enjoyed by the normal children. Moreover, the Unified Play Day being a social gathering of large number of parents of children with disabilities, is a platform forinteraction among them. They also get an opportunity to observe various proven therapies helpful to children with disabilities and interact with specialized experts of these therapeutic tools and exchange notes with other parents using these therapies. For experts, it is a great opportunity to observe children with disabilities of various categories at one place and to learn home or traditional remedies being practiced by many parents. For children, the UPD is a unique outdoor excursion and learning experience through play, yogic asanas, hand kerchief, mirror exercises, etc., conducive to their physical and mentalwell-being.

The Unified Play Day programme includes the following activities:

- 1. Group demonstration of Yoga, Flag drill, Hoops drill, Pyramid and Kerchiefdrill
- 2. Play therapy, Physiotherapy, Water therapy and Musictherapy
- 3. Sports Competition in Bocce & 5-a side football (ID), Adapted Volleyball (VI)and Throw ball(HI).

In conclusion, participating in events like the unified play day can help student teachers learn more about Adapted Physical Education and Yoga for differently-abled individuals, and can also raise awareness about the importance of inclusivity and accessibility in Education. It is important for future teachers to have a broad understanding of the needs of all their students, and events like this can help them gain that understanding.

129th Year of Swami Vivekananda's Chicago Address

Report of

State Level Recitation Competition - 2022

### Introduction

Swami Vivekananda attended the World Parliament of Religions Conference held in Chicago on September 11, 1893 and delivered a special address on behalf of India. His speech garnered worldwide attention. In his opening remarks, he addressed the audience as "Sisters and Brothers of America," which created a tremendous wave of enthusiasm. The audience responded by rising up and applauding continuously for two minutes. Throughout his speech, Swami Vivekananda advocated for religious tolerance and harmony. The American Press praised him as a "Cyclonic Monk from India" and highlighted his lofty ideals, which not only brought fame to Swami Vivekananda but also elevated the reputation of India and Hindu Dharma globally. His speech at the Chicago Parliament of Religions played a crucial role in reformulating the spirit of India and Sanatana Dharma to the Western world, dispelling misconceptions perpetuated by Westerners. Furthermore, it shattered the false image of India as a Nation of slaves and poverty, presenting it as a spiritually rich country with deep-rooted traditions and culture. This historic discourse held great significance in Indian history, and it is essential to commemorate this special day and spread the teachings of Swami Vivekananda throughout the country.

In honour of Swami Vivekananda's speech at the Chicago Parliament on September 11, 1893, Sri Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya College of Education celebrated the Universal Brotherhood Day in the college. Marking the 129th anniversary, a state-level Recitation competition was conducted exclusively for the students of higher secondary school through online mode (Google Meet). A total of 278 students registered in the competition from various parts of Tamil Nadu, The scripts of Swami Vivekananda's Chicago Address were provided to all participants 20 days prior to the competition. The participants were required







EMIS can improve transparency and accountability in education systems. By making data on education outcomes and resource allocation publicly available, authorities can be held accountable for their decisions and actions, and stakeholders can advocate for improvements in education policy and practice.

Overall, EMIS is an important tool for managing and analyzing education-related data, and can help education systems make informed decisions about resource allocation, program planning, and policy development.

Stimulation of Analytical Thinking through Mathematics among School Students

#### Introduction:

Analytical thinking is a crucial skill that enables individuals to approach complex problems and challenges by breaking them down into smaller parts, analyzing them, and then putting them back together to form a solution. It is an essential skill for students to develop, as it helps them think critically and creatively, and it is useful in various academic and professional pursuits. In recognition of the importance of analytical thinking skills, Sri Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya College of Education initiated classes to develop these skills among school students.

#### **Objectives:**

- > To promote analytical thinking skills among students from the sixth standard to the ninth standard.
- ➤ To enhance the pedagogical abilities of B.Ed. Student teachers and faculty members in delivering Mathematics education that stimulates analytical thinking.
- ➤ To create a competency-based educational approach that seamlessly incorporates analytical thinking strategies into the teaching of Mathematics.
- To establish a nurturing and participative learning setting that encourages teamwork, creativity and the development of problem-solving abilities
- > To appraise students' advancements and offer them feedback by employing evaluation and feedback methods.



#### Methodology:

#### a) Curriculum Integration:

A team of Mathematics educators, and experts and analytical thinking collaborates to integrate analytical thinking skills in existing curriculum that aligns with the national educational standards and promotes higher order thinking skills. The curriculum incorporates interactive teaching methods, problem-solving activities, and real-world applications of Mathematics.

#### b) Teacher Training:

Student teachers and faculty members received specialized training in instructional strategies that foster analytical thinking in Mathematics. The training included periodical workshops and orientations to equip teachers with the necessary skills to implement the programme effectively.

#### c) Implementation:

The programme implemented in campus schools, covering students from the first standard to the ninth standard. Teachers deliver the curriculum using a student-centered approach, encouraging active participation, critical thinking and analytical reasoning. The lessons designed to engage students in challenging problem-solving tasks and promote higher-order thinking skills.

#### d) Assessment and Feedback:

Ongoing assessment tools, such as formative and summative assessments, utilized to monitor students' progress and provide feedback.



The primary goal of Analytical Thinking classes is to develop analytical thinking skill among school students through teaching Mathematical concepts. Mathematical abilities are essential because they provide structure for rationally solving problems. It helps in the conceptualization of several areas that include verbal components such as numerical knowledge, counting and reasoning as well as non-verbal components such as Mathematical notation, reasoning in time and space, calculation, and so on.

Mathematical exercises such as puzzles, riddles, and open-ended inquiries, finding patterns, brainstorming ideas, analysing data, and making situational decisions among students were planned and executed. Application of analytical thinking components paves the way for enhancing the IQ levels. It supports the growth of pupils' critical and creative thinking. It teaches children how to think differently in a diverse range of situations. Utilization of advanced technology in analytical classes stimulates the interest, curiosity and helps pupils to familiarize Mathematical concepts easily.

#### Phase I: Trainer Training Programme:

Regular Trainer's Training Programme on Stimulating Analytical Thinking through Mathematics is conducted for student teachers and question paper setters. The Programme coordinated by Sri. V. Eswaran, Assistant Professor in Mathematics and organized by the Internal Quality Assurance Cell, Sri Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya College of Education.

The programme has been designed to introduce teaching strategies and syllabus related to stimulating analytical thinking through Mathematics. It will cover various topics including the introduction to Moodle (LMS), hands-on training in Google Sheet, Google quiz and question bank preparation using various resources. The aim of the programme is to equip Student – teachers and Research scholars with the necessary skills and knowledge to promote analytical thinking and problem-solving abilities among school students through Mathematics.



#### Phase - II: Implementation of Programme

Sri Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya College of Education initiated organising the Classes on "Stimulation of Analytical Thinking through Mathematics among School Students" for sixth grade students to ninth grade students of Sri Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya Swami Shivananda Higher Secondary School. Student-Teachers from Sri Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya College of Education and Ph.D Scholars from Department of Mathematics, Sri Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya College of Arts and Science has been handling the Analytical Thinking Classes weekly once for a period of 45 minutes duration. Analytical Thinking Tests were conducted through online mode twice in a month to assess pupils' progress. The programme coordinated by Sri. V. Eswaran, Assistant Professor in Mathematics.

Best Practice: 1- Providing inter-disciplinary curricular experience to cater to an inclusive society

#### 1.1 Objectives

Special Education teachers are linked with the institution to enable student-teachers understand the needs of an inclusive classroom. The heterogeneity of the students raises an environment to enable students to have an interdisciplinary curricular experience by collaborating with Special Education units. Such practice prepares the student-teachers to deal with the diverse needs of learners in the classroom.

#### 1.2 The Context

Inclusion is a concept that has gained a lot of importance especially during the last decade and there is a need to prepare student-teachers to cater to an inclusive society. They should be able to attend to the diverse needs of learners in the classroom. This provides the teacher experience to work with Knowledge drawn from multi-disciplines which shape the learning experience. Such practice attempts to prepare the student-teachers to handle the heterogeneous class that includes students with special needs. Inter-disciplinary curricular experience is a model where students with special needs spend their time with normal students. The goal of inclusive education is to provide the students with most appropriate learning environment and opportunity to achieve the best of their potential.

#### 1.3 The Practice

Realizing this need, theory papers in Special Education are conducted both at the B.Ed and the M.Ed levels. In B.Ed, Special Education is being offered that uncovers topics like types of disabilities, service delivery models, rehabilitation methods etc. Yet another paper namely Education of the Differently abled is offered for M.Ed where the same topics in greater depths along with reach in special education is also being taught. The services of faculty members who are members of RCI are utilized for the conduct of these courses. Opportunities are provided for M.Ed students to have a three week field internship programme at the Faculty of Disability Management and Special Education (FDMSE).

#### 1.4. Evidences of Success:

Student-teachers get to know about the curriculum and each of the Special Education units functioning in detail and get a hands-on-experience on using some of the facilities in the institution. The students are also provided with the hands-on experience in handling the equipment and corrective methods for specific disability. The alumni of the college who are working as teachers in various schools also vouched that the exposure given on topics related to Inclusive Education helped them a lot in their teaching career.

#### 1.5 Problems Encountered and Resources Required:

Adjusting the time of the internship programme to the convenience of both the institutions is the major problem encountered. Dedicated and experienced college faculty who are capable of handling papers in Special Education and keep themselves updated on the new developments in the field.

### Best Practice:2- Organizing Personality Development and Educational Programmes for the Children of the Adopted Village

#### 2.1 Objectives:

As a mark of commitment to serve the society, a village called Bharathi Nagar is adopted by the institution. All student-teachers involved in the service of the inmates of Bharathi Nagar. Focused camps were organized to ensure education and primary medical care for the children of the adopted village. The student-teachers also helped in the development of social skills among children of the adopted village. This instilled a sense of responsibility in serving the needy among the student-teachers.

#### 2.2 The context

A village called Bharathi Nagar is adopted by the institution to provide basic literacy and improving social skills among the children. Faculty and student-teachers actively participated in organizing regular interactions, camps, awareness programmes. Focus was given to the educational, medical and basic needs of the village people.

#### 2.3 The practice

Free education is offered to the children from their locality in the Vidyalaya Schools. There are four Vidyalaya schools in the vicinity where the students from Bharathi Nagar are admitted for schooling. Students from the College of Education engaged school students with free coaching classes after the school hours. Students will be picked up from their homes and they are brought to the Vidyalaya and are provided with meals at free of costs. All round care is taken of logistics, food, education, and well-being. Free medical camps and awareness programmes were also organized for the children to address the health care needs of the adopted village.

#### 2.4 Evidences of Success:

The village people had positive feedback about the initiatives taken by the institution for the betterment and overall development of the children of Bharthi Nagar. Regularity of the children of the adopted village in the Vidyalaya schools improved much. Illiteracy problems were taken care of to a great extent by providing schooling to the younger generation. The general health condition of the people in the adopted village was improved.

#### 2.5 Problems Encountered and Resources Required:

Inadequate support of illiterate elderly people in the village is a serious threat. The elderly who are illiterate refused to utilize the benefits of literacy for the younger population and thus demotivate. The resources required additional learning materials to cater to the diverse needs of the children and the resource to be ensured for the continuity of the programme.

# Practice: 3- Periodical Publication of the Abstracts of the College Journal.

#### 3.1 Objectives

Sri Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya College of Education approved research supervisors and this is the only research centre in the vicinity. Hence, the institution provided all resources for conducting research in the field of Education. The objectives of this practice are to disseminate research practices carried out in the various areas of Education, help researchers gain understanding of the work done in their areas of interest and identify topics which are worth exploring. This helped researchers to know about various research methodologies and analyze the importance of the findings of a particular study.

#### 3.2 The Context

The institution already publishes the Journal of Education Research and Extraction, and being the 58th year of the publication of the journal, Research Abstracts on Education has been compiled to present widely scattered research in a compact form, and assist in making encapsulated information and recommendations of research available to planners, programme implementers and young researchers. The abstract is not a simple abstract that the author has sent. But these abstracts are very systematically prepared to give a holistic understating of the published research that are abstracted.

#### 3.3 The practice

The college has a long legacy of nurturing research and has been publishing the 'Journal of Educational Research and Extension', a peer reviewed quarterly journal since 1964. Fifty-Seven volumes have been published till date and the abstracts combined from articles are a great source of knowledge to researchers. Only few reputed institutions publish research abstracts regularly and our institution is one among them.

#### 3.4 Evidences of Success:

The college alumni and students have reported that the publication of abstracts has helped them a lot in pursuing research in the educational field. Positive feedback has also been obtained from the colleges subscribing the journal.

#### 3.5 Problems Encountered and Resources Required

- Want of adequate prior training for those involved in preparing the abstracts
- No major difficulties encountered in publishing the abstracts



# Best practice: 4 - Accessibility of Open Online Instructional Resources in Laboratories

#### 4.1 Objectives

- To equip the student-teachers with ways of dealing with diverse learners in the classroom.
- To provide student-teachers with ways to explain concepts in clear and concrete ways.
- To equip student-teachers with skills to provide better opportunities to visualize concepts

#### 4.2 Context

Good number of open online instructional resources is available these days on all school subjects. Most of the schools may not be able to afford certain lab equipment due to cost factor or their unavailability. Online open access instructional resources are the best option in such situations.

#### 4.3 The practice

The college tried to train student-teachers in the use of such online resources so that in future, they will be able to provide better multisensory learning experiences to students. Some of the open access resources used are like TED, Periodic Videos, Biology corner, and other open educational resources. Videos by native speakers provide good understanding of the subject with understandable communication that helps the students prepare for competitive exams like IELTS etc. The subject laboratories in the college have been equipped with the required online instructional resources.

#### 4.4 Outcomes of the practice



The animations and simulations through these resources proved to be a lot helpful for slow learners during the remedial sessions.

#### 4.5 Problems Encountered and Resources Required

There needs to be good Wi-fi connectivity in the labs and needs prompt technical help in labs. Initial reluctance on the part of student-teachers to get acquainted with its access is something that needs to be fought by oneself. Support of the technical staff to install the required software and Infrastructural facilities needs support resources.


